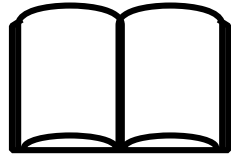


CLUSTER



1. SCRIPTURE READING

Each week, your group picks a book of the Bible to read. For larger books, you may decide to do half the book in a week. For small books, re-read the book several times through the week (eg. 3x Ephesians).

The group will **repeat** the same reading target each week until **everybody** has finished it all in the **same** week.

During your Cluster Meeting, the group leader will choose one paragraph from the group's reading target from the previous week. He or she will read it out very slowly. Each person will answer the questions:

What stands out to you?
What questions do you have from the text?



2. KEEPING ON TRACK

What is the condition of your soul?
(For example, anxiety, joy, challenge, tiredness, thankfulness, heavy...)

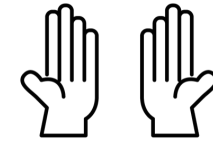
In the past week, how have you sensed God's presence or seen answered prayer?

In the coming week, what do you think the Holy Spirit is prompting you to do?

What are you planning to do about it?

Do you have a need to confess anything?

Consider your words, thoughts, and actions; your relationships, your sexual life, unhealthy desire for money/image/stuff...
When a group member confesses in the Cluster Meeting, the others listen without judgement. Someone then pronounces the Gospel to that person with simple words like,
"[Name], Jesus died for your sin and God forgives you your sin for his sake."



3. OUTWARD PRAYER

Each member of the Cluster identifies two or three people in their sphere of influence who need Jesus. The Cluster prays for these people during the Cluster Meeting, but their names are also written down and prayed for by the group throughout the week. Those who begin to seek Christ can be invited to join the Cluster or a new one!

If you're not sure where to start, here are some suggestions for prayer for these people.

I pray Lord, that you draw ... to yourself
(John 6:44)

I pray that ... will seek to know you. (Acts 17:27)

I ask you to send someone to share the gospel, or give me opportunity to share it with them. (Matthew 9:37)

Lord, I pray that ... would put their trust in Christ. (John 1:12; 5:24)
